
Giving and Receiving Gifts

- 9. Even if a person has been thanked verbally, it is always good to follow it up with a 'Thank you' note.
- 10. Gifts for babies can include pin, mugs, rattles, clothes, silver or gold objects, dresses, albums, baby blanket, music box, or simple toys.


